

As an educational leader, Dr. Martin has been an advocate for at-risk students, and has received several district, state, and national awards and recognitions for her advocacy, mentorship, and research. She has served as a mentor to high school, undergraduate, and graduate students, as well as to new teachers in a variety of areas such as writing and publishing, career and leadership development, and advocacy. Dr. Martin is the editor of the two-volume series *Women as Leaders In Education* (Praeger, 2011). She has conducted research, published numerous peer reviewed articles and book chapters on bullying and harassment, peer sexual harassment, educational equity, mentoring, issues of social justice, service-learning, and teaching at-risk students. Dr. Martin is often an invited speaker at universities and non-profit organizations on the aforementioned topics. As Action Vice President of Michigan NOW, she engages in volunteer Title IX education and advocacy work. Through this work she has been asked to comment on proposed Michigan legislation on Public Radio.
